# Sewing with Purpose

If you happen to be walking the halls of Amaro Tan after school hours – or sometimes even during summer activities – you've likely heard the subtle whir of sewing machines. Poking your head into the sewing room, you would see a handful of pupils working on various projects. Honing their skills with a sewing machine or even a simple needle and thread.

Over the past 15 years that the sewing courses have been operating, pupils have had the opportunity to learn a valuable trade. Two former students of Amaro Tan at one point even worked in a garment manufacturing company in Tirana! A more recent project of the sewing course, however, has had a different kind of impact.

At the Amaro Tan soup kitchen, we deliver food to a number of clients that cannot physically get to our facility. Every day, meals are transported in containers inside bags to the homes of these clients. The sewing course participants have created reusable bags for this exact purpose. For 5 soup kitchen clients, the pupils made 10 total bags, each with the name of the client inscribed on the bag. By having two bags per client, it allows the for the transport to be done easily; the food is delivered on one day with the first bag, and then on the next day with the second bag, collecting the first bag to be used on the following day.

This was an incredible initiative by Amaro Tan to help reduce the need for single-use plastic bags, as well as to give the pupils in the sewing course a way to help those around them in a very practical way. As Marin Piqoni, Director of Amaro Tan School, puts it: "It is great that they are putting their acquired skills to good use."

# Unlocking Potential

### After School Clubs at Shkolla NEHEMIA

This past fall semester the leadership of Nehemia School decided to try something new.

For an hour every Friday afternoon, the school organized special elective clubs for the students to take part in if they desire. As an alternative to sitting in a classroom with their books, the students had the opportunity to dive deeper into a topic in which they have an interest. The electives offered varied widely and were based on the profession or skill set of volunteers willing to spend some time each week devoted to educating youth.

"One way, how we want to achieve [our mission] is by providing students opportunities to experience various learning and life situations, so that they can gain competences and shape their personality," says School Director Elona Rira.

The afternoon clubs have continued into the spring, after positive feedback from the pupils involved in them. Elona explained, "They express the necessity to have as many extracurricular activities as possible, both of an entertaining and educational nature, to be as close as possible to real life and the needs of today's society. That was the reason we thought that afternoon clubs would be a very good opportunity for students to further develop their skills, talents, and desires in different directions in their interest."

The students were given the choice from a list of electives, many of which would not be offered in a typical school environment in Albania, including Event Organizing, Dance, Graphic Design, Ecological Farming, Music, and more.

Shkolla NEHEMIA has been operating since 1998, and so it is important for us to always be looking for new ways to interest the students and help further their education and facilitate their dreams as best we can. If one of our pupils graduates and moves on to be a successful designer, dancer, or even musician we would cherish the thought that we were able to play a small part in that.
